A blend of 40% Chardonnay. 40% Pinot Noir, and 20% Pinot Meunier, Brut Majeur is Champagne Ayala's flagship non-vintage bubbly. Full and rich with bright flavors of lemon zest, ginger, honey, crunchy green apple, and baked pears with a warm thread of biscuity brioche, it is a lovely way to unwind. Crisp, refreshing, and very ooh la la! Not familiar with Champagne Ayala? Long known as the "sleeping beauty of Champagne," Ayala was one of the 18 founding members of the "Grandes

A blend of Chardonnay (51%), Pinot Noir (40%) and Pinot Meunier (9%), this beauty was aged on the lees for 2.5 years and rested in the cellar for at least 3 months after disgorgement. Crisp and juicy with bright red fruit flavors, a hint of blood orange and a kiss of biscuit.

Champagne Ayala Le Blanc de Blancs 2013 (\$110) has succeeded in adding a bit of ooh la la to a blah day. Look at that glimmering gold hue - it's beckoning "sip me, s'il vous plait!" 100% Chardonnay from 3 Grand and 2 Premier Cru villages on the Côte des Blancs, it is crisp, chalky, creamy, fruity, nutty; an elegant tapestry of texture and flavor.

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
